Synopsis

Alana McKenzie, a new Mental Health Clinician at Long Meadow, struggles to fight against the daily oppression of corrupt institutional norms, ignorant staff, gang culture and unethical practices. In her quest to save the youth, McKenzie is presented with the daily challenge of new kids with complex issues, urgent dilemmas and various crisis situations that she must resolve.

As the story builds, McKenzie's own family struggles and relationship complexities create a host of interpersonal turmoil as she teeters between what is right and what is necessary. McKenzie's endearing persona and sarcastic wit is cleverly intermixed within a contrasting arena of pretentious coffee infused academia and the gritty sex appeal of hood life.







Each episode will give a brief inside peek of the institutional daily activity as it appears, and behind the scenes. A variety of episodes will provide an in-depth perspective of the main character's lives, habits, and personal challenges before and following incarceration while illustrating how they are intrinsic to the forward movement of the story.

Juvie is not just an institution, it's a society with its own code of conduct. The more involved McKenzie becomes, the deeper she sinks into the pit of chaos. Her dream to educate and rehabilitate youth is thwarted by the distractions of daily survival. She learns that jail is big business with investments that are protected from those highest up. No one is to be trusted, the gang culture and systematic corruption has become intangible. Does she have what it takes to survive and save the youth or will the jail ultimately destroy her.

AKA "Mickey" or "McKenzie





ALECIA CRENSHAW


AKA "OFFICER CRENSHAW"

"(34 yrs old) Childhood friend of McKenzie, Caleb is a Science teacher at Longmeadow and encourages McKenzie to take the job as a therapist.

His sensitive and receptive demeanor and handsomely imposing appearance creates a convenient and tempting avenue of support and friendship for McKenzie.

OCEAN MATEEN



"(30yrs old) Sexy, exotic, impulsive. An electrician by trade and vocal artist at heart, he is always between jobs fighting to pay bills and feed his artistic passion much to the disappointment of his love interest,

McKenzie who feels he should invest his time with establishing secure and steady employment. Ocean struggles with the conflict of being "good enough" for his counterpart or seeking comfort in the familiar surroundings of an "around the way girl".

(47 yrs old) Warden Beverly Lamont-Chief Warden for Long Meadow Juvenile Corrections. She runs a tight ship as the first Black female warden in Long Meadow history. She presents as somewhat detached and overly independent, barely leaving any emotional space for laughter or love. She is emotionally baffled when an impulsive affair with a corrections officer shifts her out of her comfort zone.



(52 yrs old) Chief Psychologist for the Mental Health unit of the prison. She appears more interested in the Q & A of charts and passing audits than the actual therapeutic engagement of her staff.

Her perfectly pressed pant suits and expressionless Botox brows appear to convey her overall goal of orchestrating damage control and maintaining her impressive salary.



(40 yrs old) McKenzie's colleague, fellow mental health therapist, Hardy is handsome and endearing yet annoyingly clueless in relation to cultural sensitivity or political correctness.


Dating his first Black girlfriend, he's often distorted in his perceptions, tipping the boundaries of what is accepted and appropriate in the Black community.

Samantha Newsome "Sam", a 17- year- old transgender girl attracts the attention of a group of neighborhood boys on the basketball court. The boys, unaware that Sam is Transgender, surround her with a barrage of sexualized compliments competing for her attention. Once the boys are told that Sam is "a boy", they engage in a vicious mob assault leaving her bruised and bloodied. Sam gathers herself and resurfaces moments later in dark sweats, a hoodie and brandishing a GUN. In a frenzied retaliation, she runs over to the boys and sprays a hail of bullets across the basketball court.

6 MONTHS LATER...

Alana McKenzie, "McKenzie" a new Psychology Grad prepares for her first day at Long Meadow Juvenile Correctional Center, one of the worst Juvenile prisons in all of Baltimore. McKenzie dresses in a sensible pantsuit, totes a new briefcase and reviews her most recent notes from grad school, but nothing can prepare her for the jail initiation she faces on her first day. Coming into the gate, she is "accidentally" groped by a security guard during search, stumbles into a gang riot in the school hall, and witnesses the physical abuse and cover up of an inmate.

McKenzie struggles to survive the constant challenges of jail life as she soon realizes that almost everyone is corrupt and orchestrating their own secret agendas.

Episodes/Concepts

EP.1WELCOME TO LONG MEADOW

Alana "McKenzie" a new Psychology grad begins her first day as a Mental Health Therapist at Long Meadow Juvenile Correctional Center. After witnessing an inmate abuse and cover up, McKenzie learns very quickly to trust no one.

EP.3 OLD FRIENDS

McKenzie reunites with an old college friend, fellow coworker at Long Meadow, Caleb. An awkward, yet tantalizing connection begins to brew as Caleb helps her navigate through some of the daily challenges of jail culture.


EP.2 CALL ME SAM
